VERDICT

The SCM19's uncompromising approach might not suit all tastes, but there are few better speakers below the two-grand mark

ATC IS ONE of the most consistent hi-fi brands we know. Its pricier products offer great dynamics, bass extension and loudness capability, but the essential character is always one of honesty. And the SCMrigs don't break with that tradition.

Let's get the criticisms out of the way. These are truthful, rather than musical speakers. They won't gloss over flaws in recordings or your

system. Equally, while they can be forthright to the point of rudeness, they don't go out of their way to be spiteful. Whatever you hear is without exaggeration.

You'll need a muscular amplifier. Consider 100-watts per channel a bare minimum for high volume levels. Cosmetics are much improved over previous generations of ATC products, but even so, these speakers look little more than

functional next to classy style statements like B&W's 805s. But it ends there – we have no more to complain about. In every other way, these speakers are gems.

Ruthless musical honesty

Placed out into the room, and mounted on heavy stands – Partington's Heavis (£400) do nicely – these monitors set a sky-high standard for this kind of money.

They're insightful enough to unearth layer upon layer of fine detail from Stravinsky's *Rite of Spring*, and have the muscle to deliver seismic dynamic shifts with considerable conviction. Stereo-imaging isn't

as airy as some rivals, but it remains rock solid and precisely focused. Let the volume level slide north,

and these speakers hold steady. And unlike smaller models in the range – the SCMrigs to be specific – they sound great at lower volumes, too. Add tuning that's more than crisp enough to do justice to The Streets, and you have great all-rounders.

If you think hi-fi is about hearing whatever the source delivers, good or bad, these are for you.
